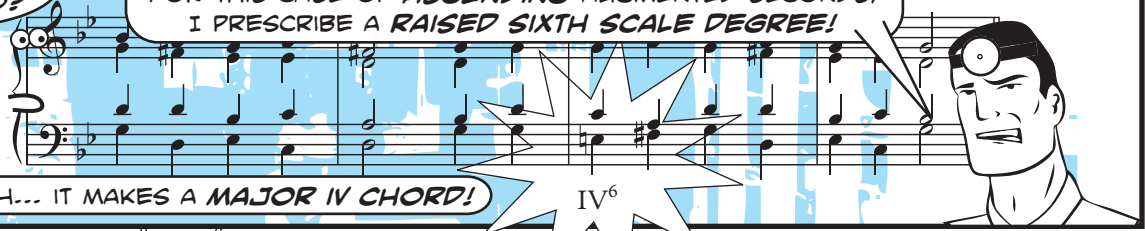
PAGING... DR. MELODIC MINOR!
